If someone gave me a choice of going to a school in a one-room schoolhouse with one teacher and students of all ages or attending school like I do today, I would not have a quick answer! To answer this question, I wanted to understand what it was like to be a student in the 1800's in Franklin Township, Hunterdon County, New Jersey. So, I did some research and learned about the history of our very own 1837 Schoolhouse that sits on the Franklin Township School (FTS) property. You would also get to see your friends almost every day except for Sundays and holidays. While I was not in school, I would be responsible and help my family around the house and farm with daily chores. After all that I have learned, I would still choose to go to school as I do today, but there are some things about attending school in a one-room schoolhouse in the 1800's that would make me want to be a time traveler and try it out!
